### **Purpose:**

On April 14, 2008, the Institute of Medicine Committee on the Future Health Care Workforce for Older Americans released a report entitled: "Retooling for an Aging America: Building the Health Care Workforce". As the 2001 report from the IOM, "Crossing the Quality Chasm" has framed the national discussion about patient safety over the past 7 years, it is likely that this new report will have a similar impact on geriatrics education for health professionals, para-professionals, and family/lay workers as well as frame the public policy debate about how to provide for the myriad health related needs of an increasingly elderly and frail older American population. The West Virginia Geriatrics Society is an interdisciplinary organization that strives to (a) develop, support, and promote the interdisciplinary practice of geriatrics and support practitioners providing such care; (b) increase the number of physicians and other practitioners\* knowledgeable about geriatrics and committed to the clinical care of older adults in West Virginia; (c) engage in a public policy effort that will advocate for improved health care for older adults in West Virginia; and (d) promote effective, high quality education that addresses the health care problems of older adults.
