Target Audience

This conference is planned for an interdisciplinary audience of physicians, nurses, pharmacists, social workers, hospital administrators and other interested health care professionals.

Program Overview and Objectives

The 2011 WVGS Scientific Assembly, “Thriving in the New Health Care Environment,” is designed for health care providers and others who are interested in the well being of the older adults in West Virginia, to obtain information on the anticipated impacts of coming changes in the health care environment. This will include sessions on: Long-Term Health Care models, a Pro/Con discussion on pain medications for the elderly, a Pro/Con discussion on whether electronic health records improve health outcomes and additional presentations on quality improvement and/or practice based changes in patient care.

The Kaiser Family Foundation, a nonpartisan health policy organization, has ranked West Virginia twelfth in the nation for the proportion of residents who receive Medicaid benefits. With more than one in five residents in West Virginia receiving Medicare benefits, the effects of the Affordable Care Act and its impact on Long-Term Health Care will also be discussed throughout the Scientific Assembly encompassing this year’s theme, “Thriving in the New Health Care Environment.”

WVGS and the WVGEC are very pleased to announce that our keynote speaker for this year’s interdisciplinary statewide education conference will be Konrad C. Nau, MD, FAAFP, CPE, Associate Dean, Chair and Professor of the Department of Family Medicine, West Virginia University Health Sciences Center - Eastern Division.
